01-26-2023 ARCADIA BOTANICAL GARDEN WITH ANS



The Los Angeles County Arboretum & Botanic Garden is a 127-acre public garden and historic site in Arcadia. The land was owned by Arcadia's founder and first mayor, prominent businessman Elias Jackson "Lucky" Baldwin, from 1875 until his death in 1909.

In 1947, the State of California and the County of Los Angeles jointly purchased the land to create an arboretum for public use. The purchase included Baldwin's former guest house (1885), now known as the Queen Anne Cottage at the Arboretum; the Carriage Barn; and the Don Perfecto Hugo Reid Adobe (circa 1840). These historic structures remain today; both the Queen Anne Cottage and the Carriage Barn are listed in the National Register of Historic Places, and the Hugo Reid Adobe is a California Historical Landmark.

Crystal Cove State Park's rolling surf, sandy beaches, tidepools, gently sloping hills, and deeply wooded canyons and ridges provide a delightful contrast to its urban surroundings. Located off busy Pa-



cific Coast Highway between Corona del Mar and Laguna Beach, Crystal Cove is one of Orange County's largest remaining examples of open space and natural seashore. The great expanse upland, north and east of the Pacific Coast Highway is enjoyed by hikers, mountain bikers, and equestrians who can follow hillside and canyon trails to primitive campsites that allow visitors to feel they are "away from it all," despite being near one of the greatest population centers in the United States.

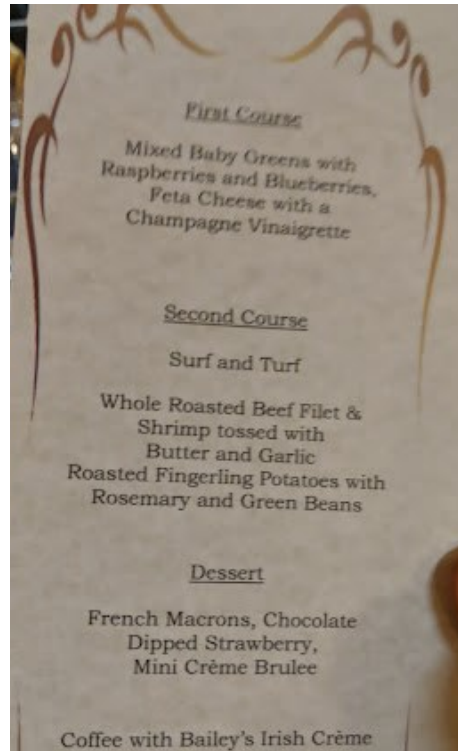

Florencio (Del) and Maria (Mary) Delgado opened their first restaurant, Las Casuelas, in downtown Palm Springs in 1958. The restaurant was named in honor of the way the family's matriarch, Maria Fajardo, prepared her family's special recipes. She immigrated from Mazatlán, Mexico, with her husband and five children and made their home in Arizona prior to the Great Depression that started in 1929.

When her husband died, she supported her family by selling homemade burritos from the back door of her kitchen to the copper miners who worked close by. Her burritos became so famous that she soon opened a café where she cooked her special recipes in earthenware "cazuelas," the Spanish name for the pots and pans she used.

Palm Springs recently made it easier for artists and property owners to express their creativity through murals around the city. The city seeks to encourage artists and property owners to come forward "because it's an easier process," City Manager David Ready told *The Desert Sun*. Named for the region's twisted, bristled Joshua trees, the park straddles the cactus-dotted Colorado Desert and the Mojave Desert, which is higher and cooler. Keys View looks out over the Coachella Valley. Hiking trails weave through the boulders of Hidden Valley.

Pioneertown, California,

is an [unincorporated community](#) of the [Morongo Basin](#) region of [San Bernardino](#)'s High Desert. The historical town was originally incorporated in 1946 and fell into the hands of San Bernardino County in the late 1960s. The winding, 4-mile (6.4 km) drive northwest to Pioneertown

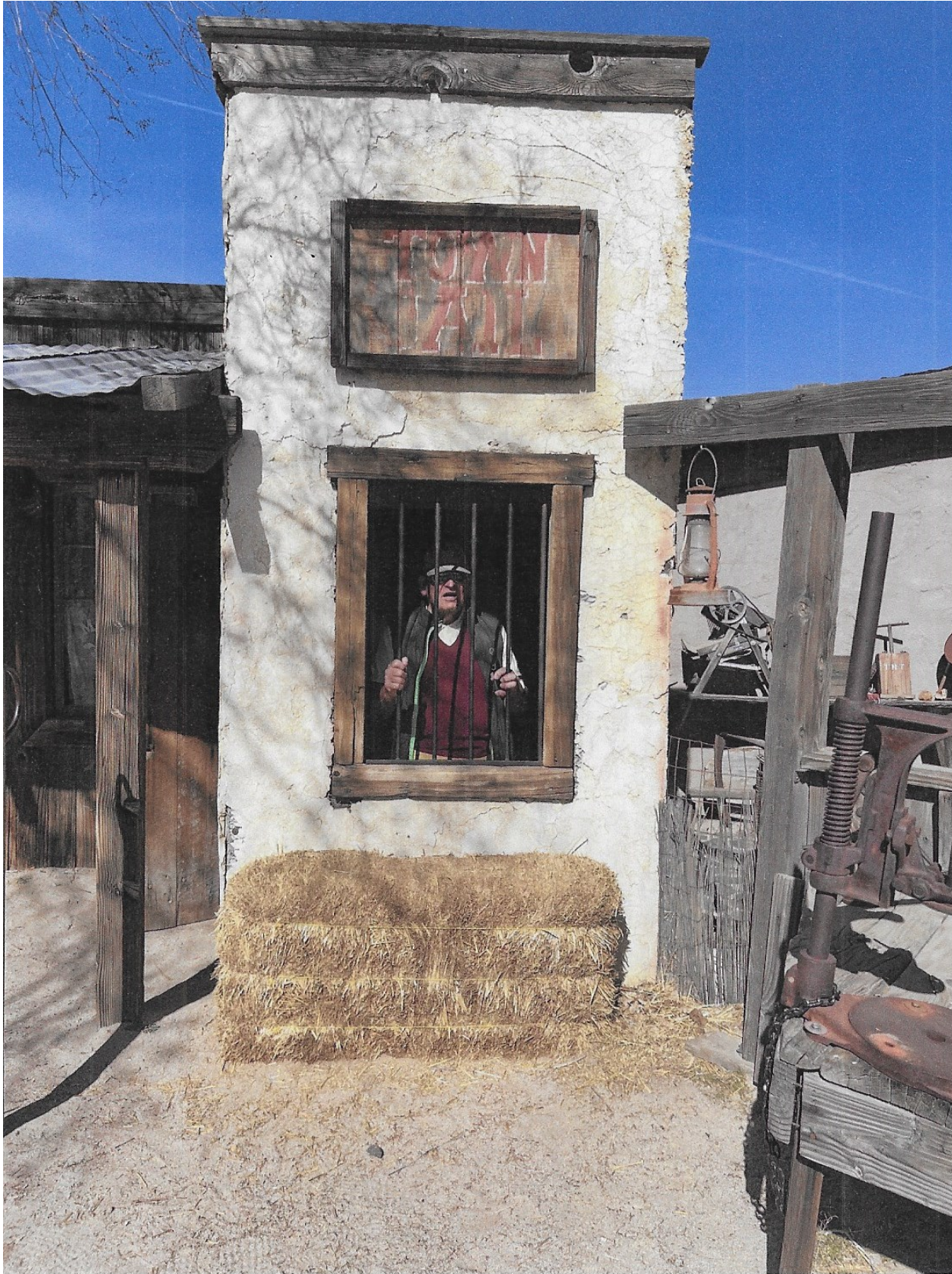


from [Yucca Valley](#) has been designated a California Scenic Drive and the area is now surrounded by privately and federally protected lands.

Dick Curtis, [Roy Rogers](#) and [Russell Hayden](#) were some of the original developers and investors. [Gene Autry](#) filmed his weekly [show](#) in town for 5 years, using the buildings and businesses as part of the film set. The first episode accidentally features the Pioneer Bowl sign, which was usually covered for filming, and Pioneer Bowl is still an operating bowling alley. The third building to be built in Pioneertown, Pioneer Bowl was used for recreation for the residents, actors and crew after filming. Roy Rogers made the front page of the local newspaper when he opened the bowl with a strike on Lane one. He bowled a 211 game in his cowboy boots with Dale Evans and 200 town folk watching. Bowling leagues were an active part of American culture, and dozens of businesses had leagues at Pioneer Bowl, especially after western films were no longer being made in town. Many locals remember being pin boys for the bowl until some of the first [automatic pinsetters](#) made by Brunswick were installed. The Thompson and White family partnership built the bowl in 1946. Mrs. White volunteered to be the first postmistress of Pioneertown, and the first post office was located inside the bowling alley.

The werewolf movie *Howling 7* was filmed in Pioneertown and used many of its locals as cast members.

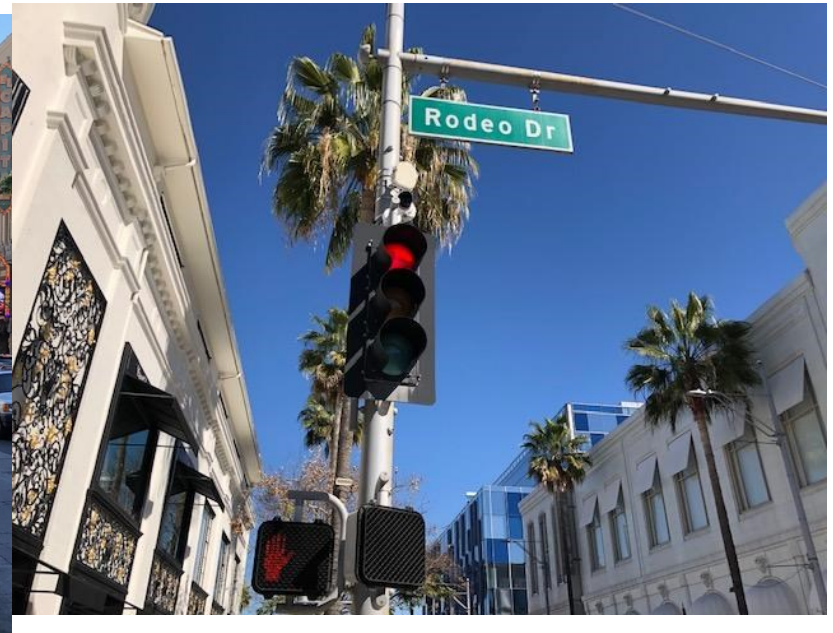

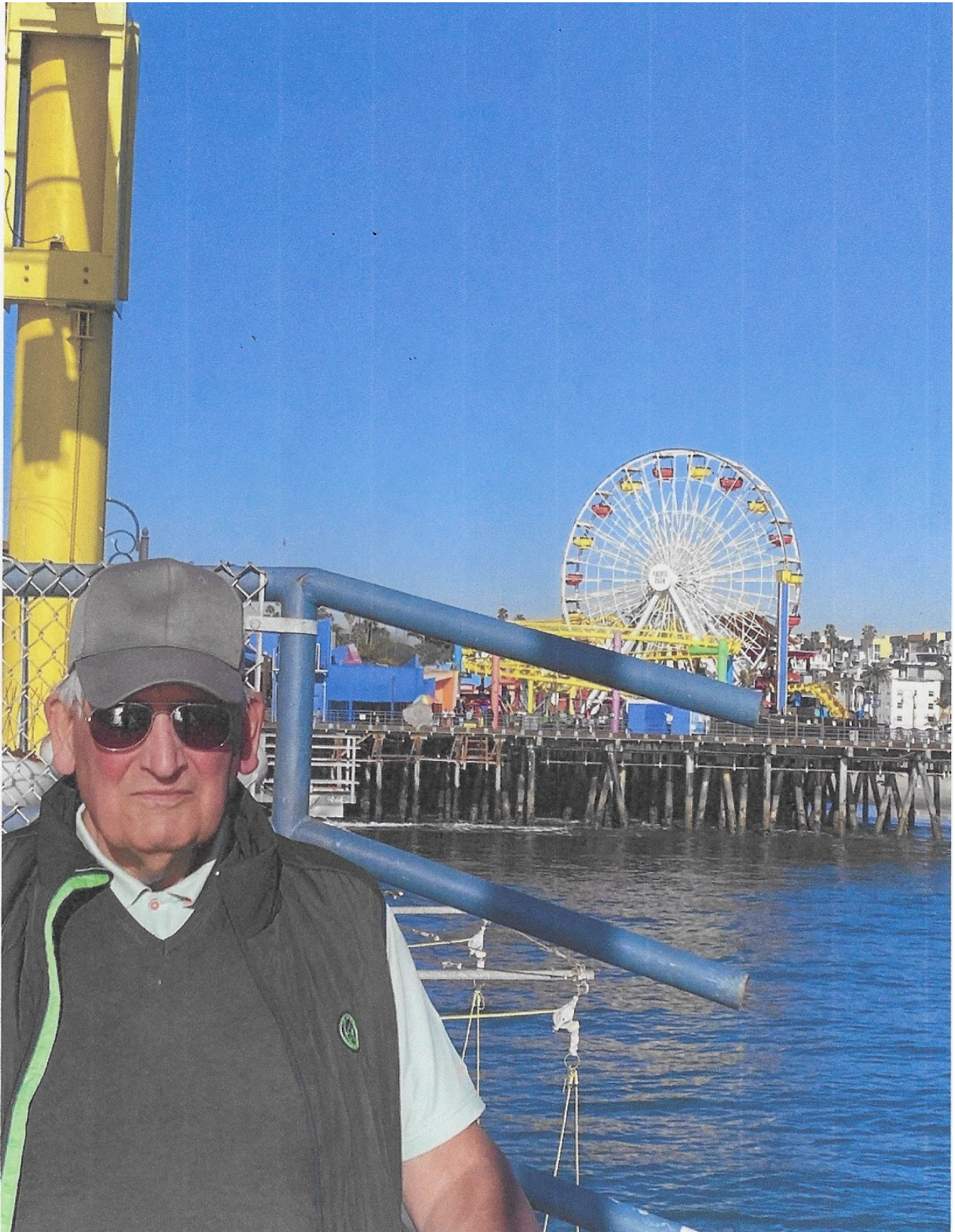

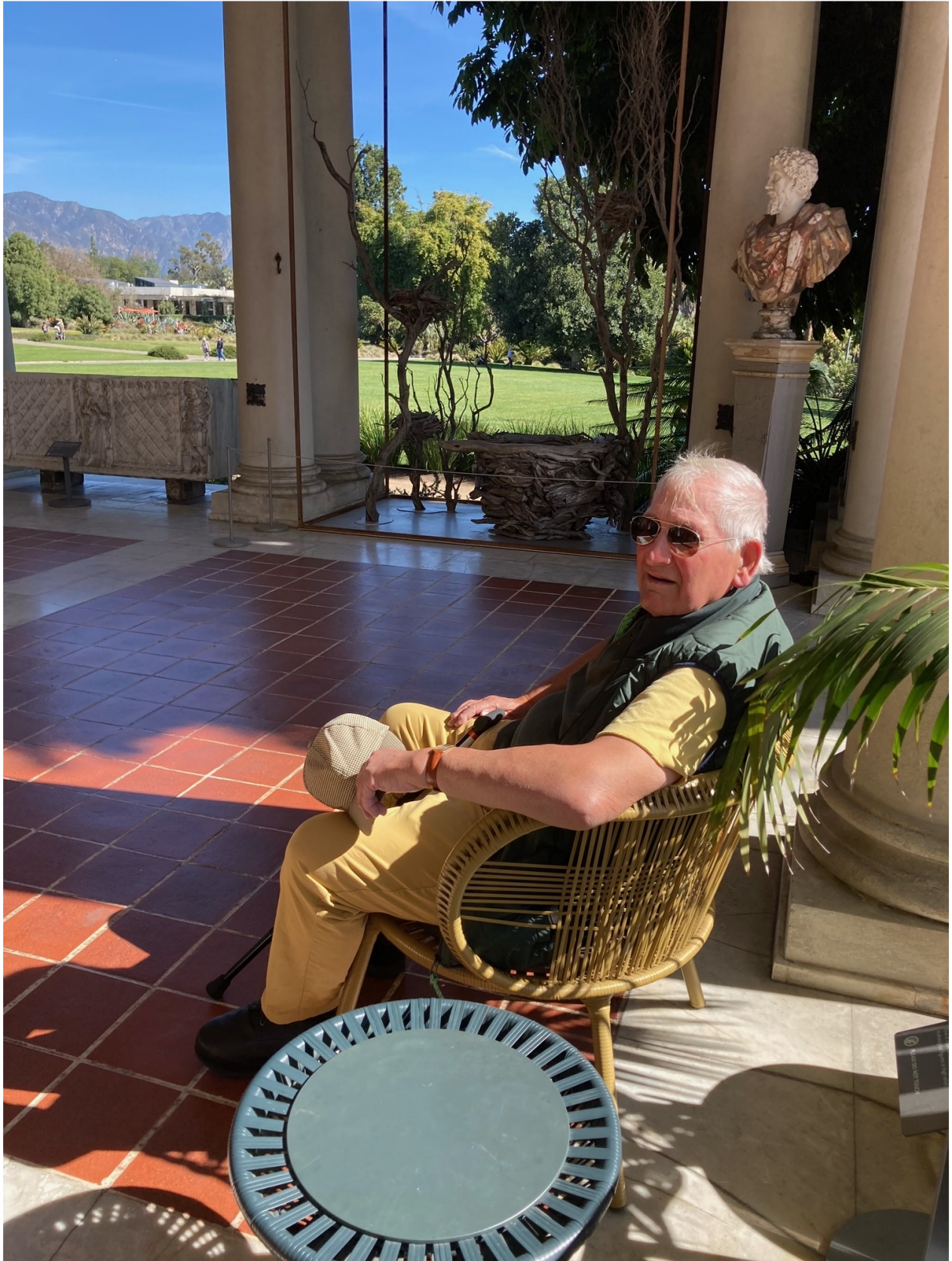

The restaurant was targeted to local farmers when it opened in 1977, but later became popular as a half-way stop on the busy highway connecting [San Francisco](#) and [Los Angeles](#).^{[10][11][12]} A 153-room luxury inn was added in 1987.^[6] It was built in [hacienda-style](#).^[11] The restaurant evolved into a "farm to fork" concept in the late 2000s, featuring not only beef but wine and other products made locally by the ranch.^[11] As of 2008 the restaurant was the 57th busiest in the United States and sixth busiest in California based on gross receipts.^[5] The site was chosen for a [hydrogen vehicle fuel station](#) as well as one of the first [battery swapping Tesla stations](#).^{[13][14]} Later, 18 superchargers were added. Then, in 2021 an expansion of 80 more V3 superchargers was planned for 2022, making it the world's largest supercharger location.^[15]

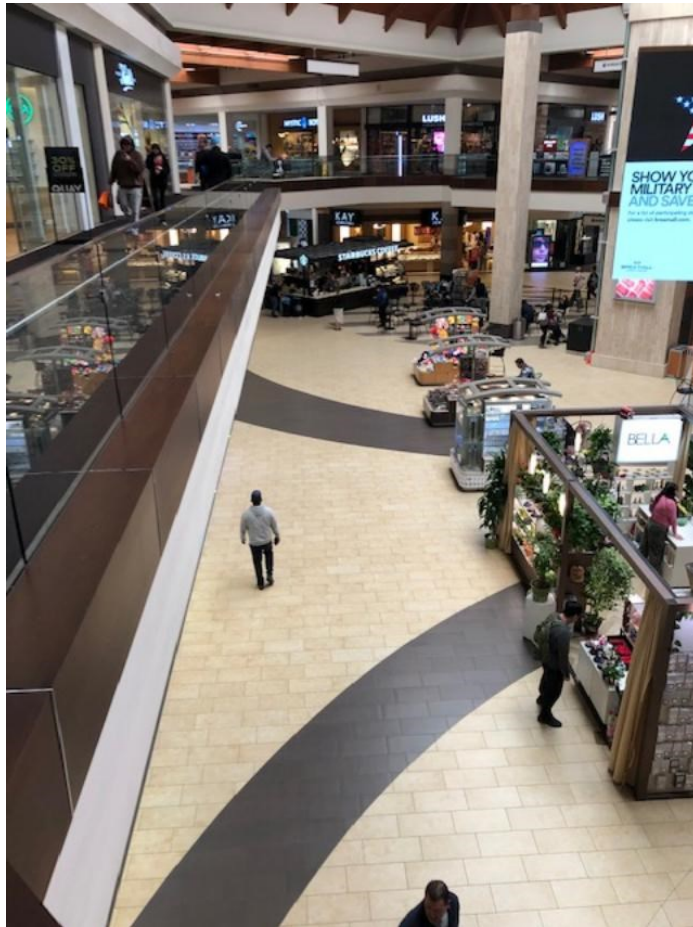
