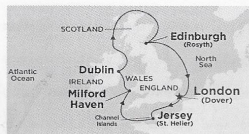

For me...an above capacity run.. Just made it because boarding already had begun.

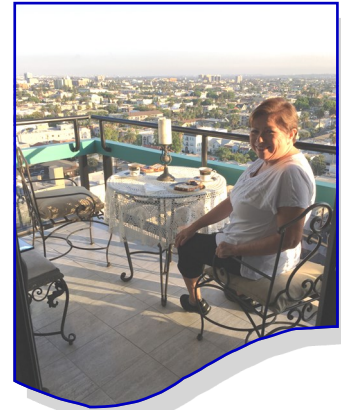
A delta 776 with every seat sold...

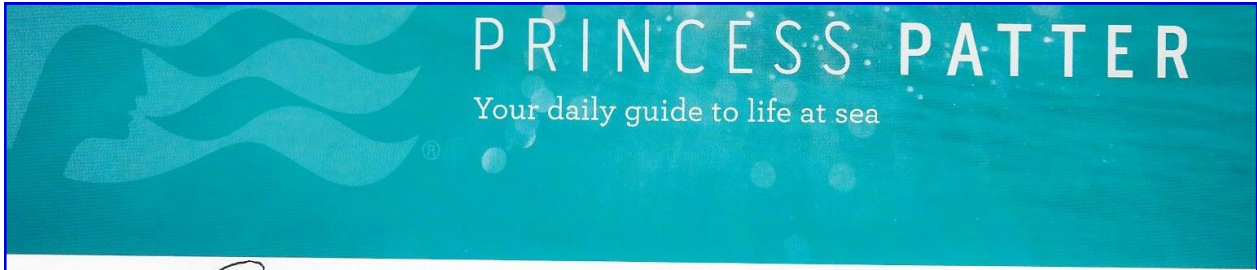

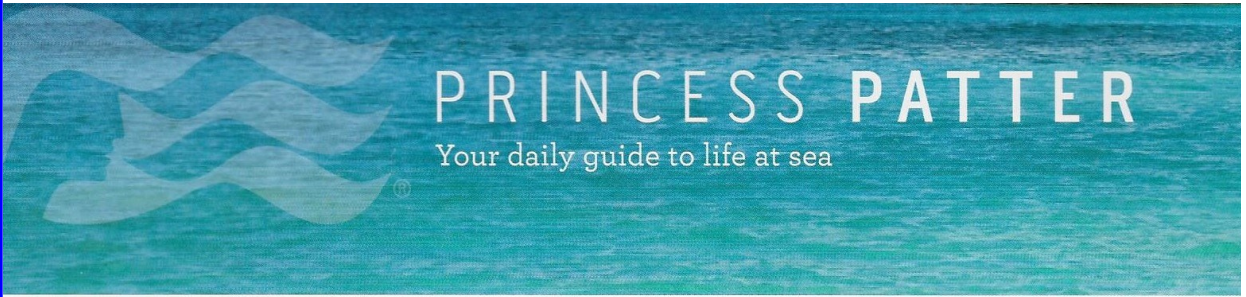

You DO NOT require a tender ticket to return to the ship.

An announcement will be made after the majority of guests have gone ashore. Thereafter you will no longer require a tender ticket and will be able to proceed ashore at your leisure.

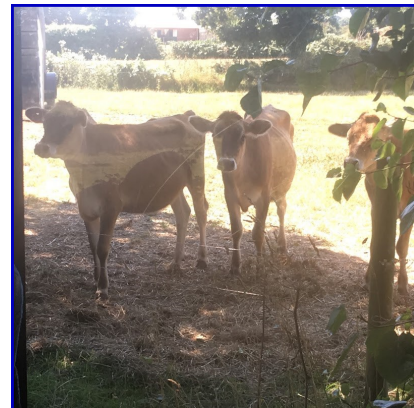

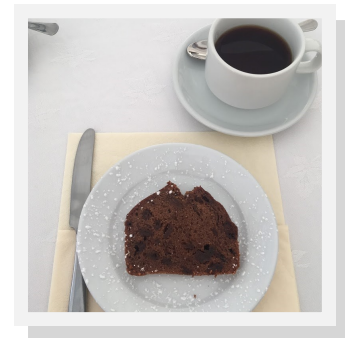

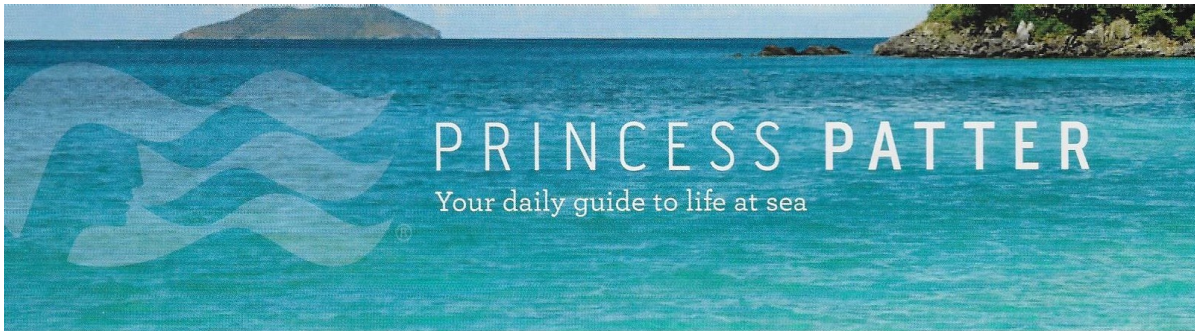

Pembrokeshire

Tenby

Henry VII Tower

MILFORD HAVEN

A magical land of adventures

From its enigmatic castles, from its rocky cliffs to its sweeping vistas of profound beauty, Milford Haven conjures up a mix of experiences you will always treasure.

Milford Haven beginnings

When you look out to the harbor, it may be a little difficult to imagine its waters filled with Viking longboats. After all, the Vikings weren't very successful in conquering Wales; however, they did settle around a natural harbor in the southwest they called Melrfjorðr or "harbor of the fjord by the sand bank" and used the area for centuries as a staging point on sea journeys to Ireland.

But the Vikings weren't the only ones who used this tranquil spot as a base of operations for invasions. Henry II in 1167 and Oliver Cromwell in 1649 both set sail from here in hopes of conquering the Emerald Isle.

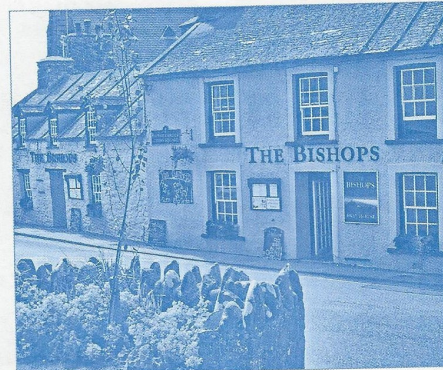
Even with all this activity, Melrfjorðr, later Anglicized into Milford Haven, wouldn't be officially founded until 1790 by Sir William Hamilton who had visions of turning this new village into a major whaling port. The grid pattern he created of three streets rising sharply parallel to the waterway is still evident as you stroll through this charming town.

Castles and kings

Medieval castles seem to have an air of mystery about them. Is it their political and formidable history that makes them so captivating or is it the haunting beauty of the architecture? You may be able to answer the question with visits to two colossal castles tucked in the hills surrounding Milford Haven.

Pembroke Castle is an imposing structure. Entrenched atop a towering ridge, it's believed that this mighty fortress is just one of a long line of strongholds that occupied this site since the Roman period. Erected in the 11th century, Pembroke is important as the birthplace of King of England Henry VII in 1457 and the tower that he was born in is now known as the Henry VII Tower.

Celebrated as one of the most magnificent castles of south Wales, Carew Castle has a history dating back 2,000 years. Built on the site of an Iron Age fort, the castle overlooks a 23-acre millpond and Carew Mill, Wales' only restored tidal mill. A stroll around the splendid one-mile circular walk offers marvelous views of the castle and the 11th century Carew Cross, one of the finest early medieval Christian monuments in Wales.



St. Davids

Awe-inspiring beauty

Medieval castles may be the centerpiece of Milford Haven, but its serene splendor is a magical mix of panoramic vistas, majestic mountains and man-made wonders.

As Britain's only coastal national park, Pembrokeshire Coast National Park wraps 186 miles around the entire western section of Wales. With commanding views of St. Bride's Bay, the park is home to Skomer Island, one of the most important seabird breeding sites in southern Britain, and the Preseli Mountains, famed for the stones that were chiseled out of their sides and used in the building of Stonehenge.

Saint David, Wales' patron saint, established the town that bears his name in 589 A.D. Nestled inside Pembrokeshire Coast National Park, this centuries-old village was once the largest and most important medieval diocese in Wales. Today, St. Davids is Britain's smallest city and host to Wales' most important cathedral. Consecrated in 1131, St. Davids Cathedral attracted pilgrims including King William the Conqueror. The wealth and power of the church is evident in nearby Bishop's Palace. Erected in the 13th century, the main structure of the palace and many of the walls survive offering a glimpse into the lives of the bishops and the spiritual significance of early Christians.

Full of adventure and history, vibrant Milford Haven and its astounding landscapes are just waiting to be explored. With so much to see and do there's only one thing to say, "dod ymweld," or, as they say in English - come and visit.

If scenic beauty and rolling countryside entice you, this motorcoach tour, offering all the sights with minimal walking, is for you. Pause for refreshment and enjoy a traditional Welsh tea complete with bara brith - the famous "speckled bread" of Wales, which was originally a variation of the weekly loaf. Bite into this succulent slice filled with raisins and currants, made from an old family recipe. At the completion of your tour, settle back in your seat on the motorcoach and travel country roads through historic inland Pembrokeshire on your picturesque return to Milford Haven port.

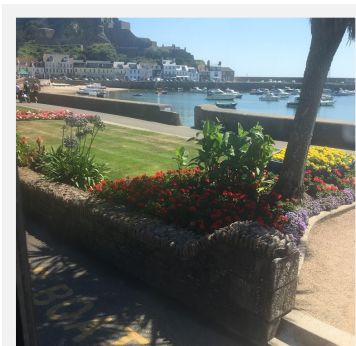

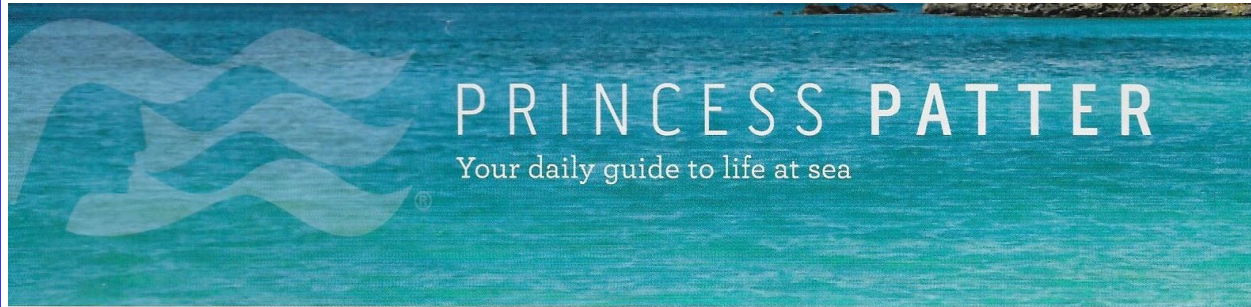

St. Patrick's Cathedral

Built in honor of Ireland's patron saint, St. Patrick's Cathedral is the largest church in Ireland. It's said to be the earliest Christian site in Dublin where St. Patrick baptized converts.

Trinity College

Trinity College is Ireland's oldest university and one of the great universities of the world. Trinity College Library is the home to the Book of Kells.

Guinness Storehouse &/or Visiting a Pub
Dublin has over 1,000 pubs and several hundred types of beers. St. James's Gate Brewery, a brewery founded in 1759 in Dublin by Arthur Guinness, is today the largest brewer of stout. The Guinness Storehouse is Ireland's number one visitor attraction and tells the story of the "black stuff."

Dublin — Sunday, August 5, 2018

At 05:30am, we boarded the local pilot and head into the Irish port of Dublin, by 06:50am we were made fast for the day. At 18:08 we let go our lines and moved astern, swung the vessel inside the port, and headed back out into the Irish Sea, where we set a Northerly track towards Scotland.

WELCOME TO SAINT PATRICK'S CATHEDRAL

Prayer has been offered at this place for centuries. According to traditions, Saint Patrick used a nearby well to baptise converts to Christianity and a small church was built marking it as a sacred place near the heart of Dublin. The present building dates from 1220 and over the centuries the Cathedral has experienced and survived wars, revolutions, and a reformation. Today the Cathedral continues to welcome new generations with open doors.

Saint Patrick's Cathedral is the National Cathedral of the Church of Ireland, a member church of the Anglican Communion. It is a very special place; for worship through daily services and song and for a memorable learning experience, it is a microcosm of Irish history filled with uniquely inspiring stories.

THANK YOU

All money raised through the shop and the welcome desk goes directly to supporting the operations cost of the maintenance and restoration of this very special 800 year old building.

- ◆ This ancient place of worship is home to many depictions of Ireland's most famous saint. It is not known what he actually looked like so you will see many different images of him in the Cathedral, including the statue in this area and the beautiful west windows.
- ◆ The Early Christian grave slabs on display here provide a glimpse of the ancient history of this site. These slabs are a thousand years old and show that this site was in use long before the Cathedral existed.
- ◆ The medieval cathedral played a central role in many historic events. In 1492, a feud between the Butlers of Ormonde and the Fitzgeralds of Kildare led to the families seeking refuge in the Cathedral. After arguing through the Chapter House door, Gerald Fitzgerald threw his arm through a hole in the door as an offer of peace. The Butlers accepted and peace was made, giving rise to the phrase "no chance your arm".
- ◆ The Tree of Remembrance allows visitors to remember anyone in their lives affected by conflict. The regiments colours embody the saying *ad maiora et ad meliora* - they step out over as their flag shortly fade away over time.
- ◆ Music has been fundamental to the daily life of the Cathedral since its foundation in 1191. On display here is an organ console dating from 1901. The spiral staircase leads to today's cathedral organ, which accompanies the choir during services.
- ◆ The Knights of Saint Patrick were a chivalric order founded by King George III in 1783. Their names, banners and busts are on display here.
- ◆ The 16th and 17th centuries saw religious reform sweep across Europe. The Cathedral's denomination changed several times in this period before ultimately remaining Anglican following William of Orange's victory at the Battle of the Boyne. The grave of the Duke of Schomberg, killed during this battle, can be seen here.
- ◆ The Lady Chapel was added in 1270 and was used by the Hagenstons from 1666 to 1816. It was removed in 2013, offering us a glimpse of its original colours. It is now used as an area for worship and quiet reflection.
- ◆ Two services are sung in the Cathedral each day. Mass in the morning and Evensong in the evening. The first two rows of the stalls here are used by the choir. All visitors are welcome to attend these services.

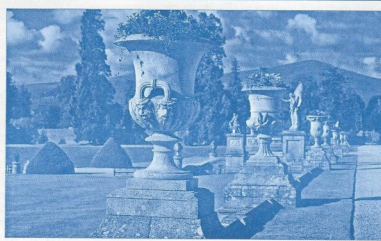

THE TREE OF REMEMBRANCE

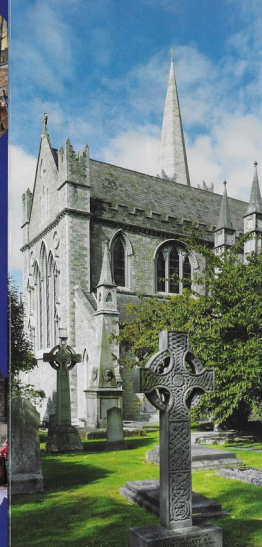

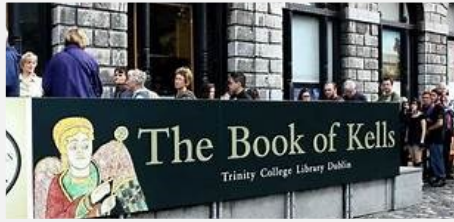

the collegiate universities of Oxford and Cambridge, but unlike these other ancient universities, only one college was ever established; as such, the designations "Trinity College" and "University of Dublin" are usually synonymous for practical purposes. The college is legally incorporated by "the Provost, Fellows, Foundation Scholars and other members of the Board" as outlined by its founding charter.[9] It is one of the seven ancient universities of Britain and Ireland, as well as Ireland's oldest surviving university. Trinity College is widely considered the most prestigious university in Ireland and amongst the most elite[citation needed] in Europe. This is principally due to its extensive history[, reputation for social elitism and unique relationship with both the University of Oxford and the University of Cambridge. In accordance with the formula of *ad eundem gradum*, a form of recognition that exists among the three universities, a graduate of Oxford, Cambridge, or Dublin can be conferred with the equivalent degree at either of the other two universities without further examination. Trinity College, Dublin is a sister college to St. John's College, Cambridge and Oriel College, Oxford

Victorian Kitchen Gard

This beautiful two and a half acre restored Victorian Kitchen Garden showcases the growing of fruit, vegetables and flowers.

HISTORY
The Garden was part of the Under-Secretary's Demesne and is shown on maps from 1838 onwards. The main purpose of the garden was to provide the household with fresh fruit, vegetables and flowers. In 1854, a Jacobs Owen designed glasshouse was added along the northern wall.

RESTORATION
Restoration began in 2006 and we hope to complete it by 2011. We have restored the original layout with a double herbaceous order running its entire length. The purpose of the garden is to raise awareness of the importance of growing fruit and vegetable crops in a sustainable manner, while demonstrating the methods which make this practice possible.

FRUIT AND VEGETABLES
Many traditional and ornamental varieties of vegetables and fruit are planted within the various plots. The garden is managed on a rotational system whereby the crops are divided into different family groups and each group is rotated. The garden is currently managed using organic principles.

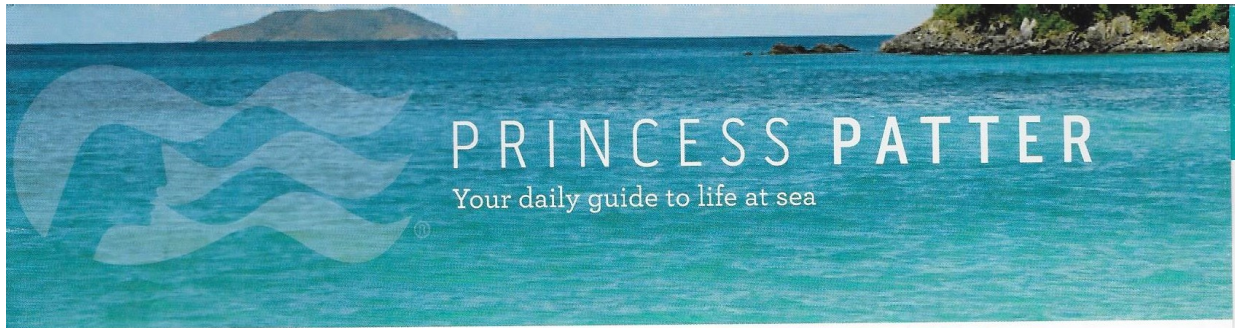

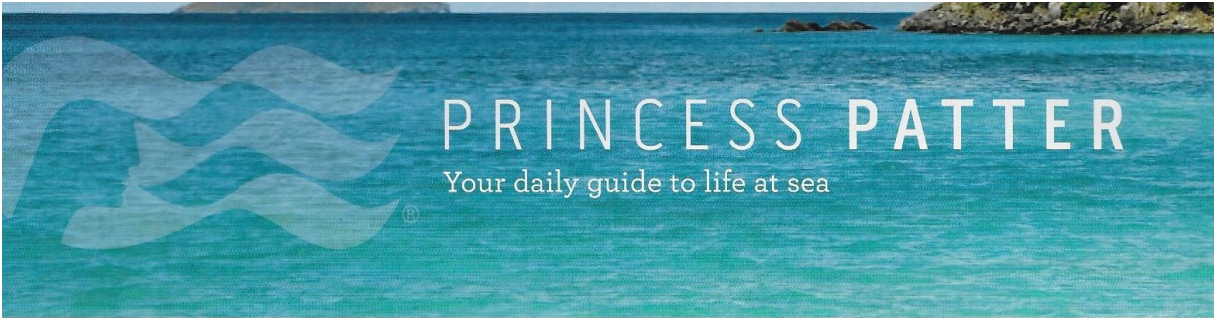

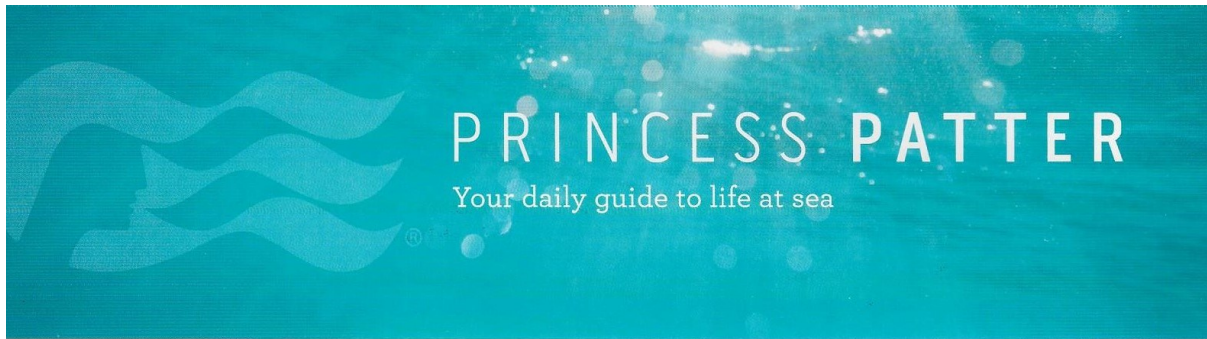

The capital of Scotland is a thriving UNESCO World Heritage Site. Its amazingly preserved medieval Old Town and its lovely 18th century New Town are recognized as exceptional architectural wonders unrivaled in Europe. But Edinburgh's also the portal to a fascinating countryside full of never-ending charm and beauty.

Castle town
The city's earliest history begins during the Bronze Age when a fort was built atop Castle Rock. Since that time, Edinburgh has been passed back and forth between invaders but always reclaimed by the Scottish. Around 79 A.D. Roman troops occupied an area around the River Forth until 122 A.D. when they left to help build Hadrian's Wall in the south. Then, in the 7th century the English captured this part of Scotland and named this place Eiden's burgh, an old word for fort. 300 years later the Scottish recaptured the area and became a part of the Kingdom of Scotland. Late in the 11th century King Malcolm III built a fortress known as Edinburgh Castle and Eiden's burgh flourished. During the 18th and 19th centuries Edinburgh's wealth and middle classes continued to grow and Edinburgh became an important center of intellectual and academic achievement in the Western world.

Enchanting Edinburgh
A mesmerizing UNESCO World Heritage Site, Old and New Town beckon you to explore a treasure trove of cultural and architectural delights. Coach tours take you through the New Town area, where elegant Georgian buildings and contemporary design abounds. Here, you'll get a glimpse of how life was lived by the city's upper classes in the 18th century. Sitting comfortably next to these graceful buildings is Princes Street, Edinburgh's modern district known for its shopping, boutiques and cafes.
